NSS JIIT-128 conducted a Workshop on Waste Management on the 16th of December 2019, with its primary objective being to promote the Swachh Bharat Mission. Dr Nilu Chaudhary served as the faculty in-charge of the activity. 70 students from the JIIT-128 campus volunteered in the drive by visiting the nearby village of Sultanpur and promoted healthy waste management habits among the residents the village.

H. Brief description of the activity with appropriate details.

Under the leadership of faculty in-charge Dr Nilu Chaudhary, 70 students from JIIT-128 visited the nearby village of Sultanpur, with the purpose of inquiring about the garbage disposal methods of various residents of the village. Students and teachers went from home to home, asking various residents of the village about their way of dealing with waste. The volunteers were met with varied response, only a few residents of the village even knew what happens to the garbage they throw out. Many residents of the village, when asked whether they knew why waste

management is import, had no idea of it. The volunteers then proceeded to brief the residents about it. The information collected was safely documented and used to help the residents plan out their waste disposal.

Inculcating among the residents healthy habits of dealing with the waste/garbage and its impact on the environment and how a little careful approach towards managing waste can change the world is very important and this is what the NSS volunteer tried to inculcate into them.

The 70 volunteers divided themselves in small groups and spread out in the village community and educated residents in a one to one interaction to better educate them.

The volunteers gathered people at a common place and taught them about the environment and how waste affects it and how to effectively manage waste to safeguard environmental integrity and motivated them to practise good waste management techniques in their daily lives in their homes.

It was propagated to students that they could be part of this event by submitting a poster on any of the topics aforementioned. Prizes were given to the best poster. To amplify the social cause the posters were also showcased on the Notice Board and the official instagram handle of NSS JIIT 128.

Brief description of the Event:

To highlight the importance of following social causes an event was designed where students were asked to make posters, handmade or using a software, that would suffice the need of the causes.

‘Say no to Plastic’: Plastic pollution is a problem that the whole world is facing together. We are finding microplastic pieces in our waterways, the food we eat, and the water we drink. Posters are invited for generating awareness about actions needed to be part of the say no to plastic movement.

'Women safety': Women are at risk of violence both in public and private spheres, in and around the home, in neighbourhoods and at city level. Posters for Women's safety involves topic such as strategies, practices and policies which aim to reduce gender-based violence (or violence against women), including women's fear of crime.

'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao': Social construct discriminating against girls on the one hand, easy availability, affordability and subsequent misuse of diagnostic tools on the other hand, have been critical in increasing Sex Selective Elimination of girls leading to low Child Sex Ratio. Since coordinated and convergent efforts are needed to ensure survival, protection and empowerment of the girl child, posters are invited for the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao initiative.

'Women Health and Hygiene': We believe that rural women's health and welfare is of prime importance and conducts menstrual hygiene camps with an aim to create awareness on adopting hygienic practices amongst women. Posters that could be used to educate women on the proper usage and disposal of sanitary pads are invited.

The demographic details that are residence address information of the person and also their biometric information which is photograph, Iris – scan, fingerprints are all collected and stored in a centralized database, for deciding uniqueness of every individual.

H. Introduction:

Addressing job creation and issues related to employment-unemployment have been important priorities of the Government. Several Ministries, Departments and agencies collect and disseminate employment data in various forms in the country. Among the primary agencies involved in this activity are Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI), Labour Bureau in Ministry of Labour and Employment (MoLE) and the Registrar General & Census Commissioner of India in the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).

I. Brief description of the activity with appropriate details:

In India, household based Employment-Unemployment Surveys are conducted by the NSS under MoSPI, the Annual Labour Force Survey by MoLE and the Population Census by Office of the Registrar General & Census Commissioner. The Employment-Unemployment Survey (EUS) is a comprehensive household survey providing labour force statistics in India. It was first conducted in the 9th round of the National Sample Survey (NSS) in 1955. The current format of quinquennial surveys started in the 27th round in 1972-73, based on M.L. Dantwala committee report. Since

then, 8 quinquennial surveys have been conducted with the last one conducted during 2011-12. The EUS is carried out over a period of 12 months to account for seasonal variations in employment.

Recognizing India's evolving economy and requirements, it was decided to make a few changes with respect to availability of household data on employment-unemployment. The first was to conduct household surveys on an annual basis; secondly introduce a time-use survey to assess the time disposition of household members; and thirdly, introduce the use of technology that can speed up data collection and processing to reduce the time lags.

The drive helped us know the number of people that were unemployed in the nearby villages. Along with this we educated people about various schemes that can be beneficial for them. Skill india program was briefed by our volunteers to educate them about the benefits of this scheme to hold them a chance of being the beneficiaries.

H. Introduction:

Priyadarshini is a pilot project for Women Empowerment and Livelihood Programme in Mid-Gangetic Plains which is currently being implemented in UP and Bihar. With a holistic approach towards enabling a strong skill development system employment opportunity is provided to underprivileged women of village Asgarpur and Sultanpur. They were provided a stitching machine to provide them a source of income. They were provided clothes from an export house to design bags for everyday purpose. It also helped us to cater to “Say no to plastic” initiative under Swachh Bharat Scheme.

Mahatma Gandhi had rightly said, “Sanitation is more important than Independence”. He was aware of the pathetic situation of Indian rural people at that time and he dreamt of a clean India where he emphasised on cleanliness and sanitation as an integral part of living. Unfortunately, after 67 years of independence, we have only about 30% of the rural households with access to toilets. President Pranab Mukherjee, in his address to Parliament in June 2014, said, “For ensuring hygiene, waste management and sanitation across the nation a “Swachh Bharat Mission” will be launched. This will be our tribute to Mahatma Gandhi on his 150th birth anniversary to be celebrated in the year 2019”.

I. Brief description of the activity with appropriate details:

The idea behind the drive was to provide a source of income to underprivileged women. Through the drive we were able to provide 10 girls with stitching machines they are now able to stitch clothes for women and everyday items. Through the program they are also teaching stitching to the girls in their surroundings. Through this drive we were able to help these women furnish the skill they already knew and they were able to enable more girls like them by teaching them this skill. They were provided clothes from an export house to design bags for everyday purpose. It also helped us to cater to "Say no to plastic" initiative under Swachh Bharat Scheme.

The idea of waste management was also seeded in the minds of people during the drive. Villagers were informed that waste if left untreated poses a serious threat to the environment, risk the life of inhabitants of the nearby areas and how their small contribution in disposing the dry and wet waste in separate waste bins could help in waste management and its segregation to a great extent.

Villagers were encouraged to keep their surroundings clean and were also informed that some of the disposed waste has the potential of being recycled, reused and can be turned into potential wealth. Hence its segregation and management is necessary. Design of the first batch of bags under the initiative "Say no to Plastic" started on 16th September. Bags were designed by faculty incharge along with 10 tailors to reduce the use of harmful plastic bags prevalent in the society. These bags were then dispatched with volunteers and teachers in the Sultanpur village and other villages nearby and the waste management idea was seeded in everyone's mind. The volunteers spread awareness about how harmful plastic is that we use everyday not only to us but also to those animals and humans around us. It is necessary to know about waste management and sanitation.

All in all, it was a successful drive where we provided employment to 10 women of the village

Brief description of the Event:

Annual PTM was decided to be conducted in the Asgarpur village. To provide information about Govt. schemes to students and parents was our parallel aim. While addressing participants, Ms. Kritika and the volunteers urged them to be aware about government schemes and make use of them for the benefit of their families and the community.

They said people should not be ignorant of the government's welfare measures in their locality. Of the innumerable government schemes available in India, only a minor section of the country's almost 1.36 billion population avails and benefits from them.

1) Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY)

This central scheme offers a platform for universal access to banking services, like basic savings bank account, remittances facility, insurance and pension.

2) Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana

This scheme is a one year renewable life insurance plan. A life cover of Rs 2 lakh is provided at an annual premium of Rs 330 payable at the time of renewal of the plan. The premium will be deducted from the account holder's savings bank account through 'auto debit' facility.

3) Sukanya Samridhi Yojana (SSY)

Part of the Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao Yojana, SSY aims to meet education and marriage related expenses of the girl child.

4) Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (ABPMJAY)

Touted as the world's largest health insurance scheme, ABPMJAY was launched to cover ten crore poor families in urban and rural areas. It offers an insurance cover of Rs 5 lakh per family.

5) National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP)

The NSAP is a social security scheme for the welfare of elderly, disabled, widows and families whose primary breadwinner has died. The scheme is supposed to fulfill article 41 of the Indian Constitution which directs the Centre and State governments to support unemployed, [elderly](#), sick and disabled citizens.

Say no to crackers:

In India, air pollution goes up by about 50% in India during Diwali. According to New Delhi-based Centre for Science and Environment, firecracker pollution due to Diwali just before winter will have a deadly impact because it the time of the year when the air is saturated. Increased pollution level during Diwali contributes to smog (a mixture of smoke and fog) that causes health hazards like skin burning and lung cancer. During Diwali noise pollution is as harmful as air pollution. Crackers produce between 90dB and 130dB of sound. Diwali is a festival of life also and it is better to avoid bursting crackers. The festival can become delightful by having a get together with friends and relatives and distributing sweets which doesn't contribute to any kind of pollution.

Plantation:

Considering the manifold benefits of trees, including that they release oxygen into the air, absorb unpleasant odors as well as harmful gases such as carbon dioxide, carbon monoxide and sulfur dioxide from the air and purify it, protect us from dangerous ultra-violet rays, provide us with food and the pivotal role played by trees in preventing soil erosion, maintaining ecological balance and most especially in lessening the effects of global warming, the NSS team conducted the poster making competition in order to raise consciousness amongst the students .

Blood Donation:

Blood has four groups namely, A, B, AB and O. The required group must be the same while transplanting otherwise the transplantation will go in vain and even the patient may die. The man with the O-group blood is called the universal donor as the people having others can accept it. On the contrary, the man with AB group of blood is called the universal receiver as he can accept all groups of blood. Blood can be stored for a limited period of time that is why the blood banks need a steady and constant collection. Nowadays a public awareness is noticed to donate blood. Many clubs, colleges, societies, offices, etc. organize blood donation camps on different occasions. It is a healthy gesture. We must keep this aptitude up at any cost. Our blood banks are running short of required blood. By organizing such blood donation camps we may help them to enrich their capacity. However, it is very important that while taking blood from a certain person the concerned authority must make sure the blood is not infected. Blood donation is our human duty. Our body does not get affected if we donate blood. The body can repair the loss within a few days. So we must come forward to donate blood as it can make sure the return of a dying man again into the light of life.

H. Brief description of the activity with appropriate details:

What is a Disaster?

Students were informed about ‘What can be categorized as a Disaster and how can we identify potential hazards around us and prevent them’. A disaster is a sudden, calamitous event that seriously disrupts the functioning of a community or society and causes human, material, and economic or environmental losses that exceed the community’s or society’s ability to cope using its own resources. Though often caused by nature, disasters can have human origins. The combination of hazards, vulnerability and inability to reduce the potential negative consequences

of risk results in disaster. A brief doubt session was also done on the same for student's queries. It provided ample information on the topic and cleared misconceptions related to understanding of disasters.

Introduction of NDRF and its Key Features.

The NDRF Officials introduced the students about various aspects of NDRF. NDRF works on all the three levels i.e NATIONAL, STATE, DISTRICT .We were also told about battalions allocated to NDRF, It comprises of 12 Battalions aided by volunteers across the country. The vehicles and equipments used by NDRF are also world class and units are provided special training for the same. Students were also told about some world acclaimed accomplishments of NDRF.

Role of NDRF in Disaster Management.

A informative presentation was done on role of NDRF and Disaster Management. The role of Control Room and the process of first response to any disaster was discussed. Students learned about the disaster cycle process with each step discussed briefly. Also responsibilities of a citizen of the country in case of disaster were mentioned. The approach of tackling with different disasters from small scale to large scale was also discussed. Roles of army, navy ,air force in case of any disaster were also mentioned. The role of government and prime minister who also acts as the chairperson of NDRF in any disaster was told.

Training Exercises for Emergency Situations.

Javans of the 08 battalion of NDRF trained our students in various types of exercises. Different techniques of lifting and carrying the victim were taught with our students volunteering as well. Famous techniques like fireman's carry, two hand carry, three hand, etc were displayed. Many ways of sliding a victim to safety were shown. The Do's and Don'ts involved during these techniques were mentioned. Also a tutorial on how to make a makeshift stretcher was done. We were also taught about steps to approach a unconscious victim, checking the pulse, identification of external or internal bleeding, proper dressing of a cut or wound etc. Also a must follow rule 'own safety first' was emphasized upon. Students were asked to always contact a concerned authority and inform people about the disaster first. The well known CPR was also shown and

practiced by the students with proper safety measures. Many other life saving exercises were done.

Ending Ceremony.

After the exercises , Our faculty in charge **Mrs. Nilu Choudhary** thanked the NDRF team and gave some words of wisdom on the topic. Token of appreciation were presented to the respective captains and javans of NDRF. Students assured the NDRF team on acting responsibly in case of disaster. Group photos featuring team NDRF and students , faculty were taken. Thus, ended a greatly informative session.

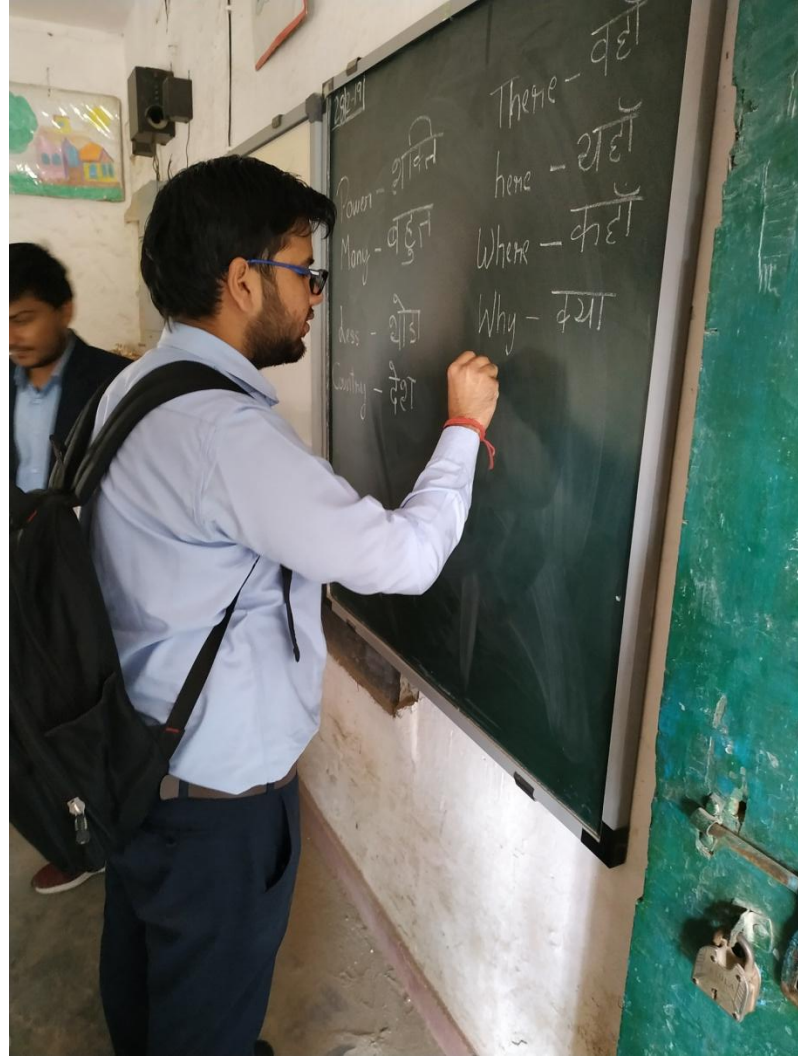

Report of Aadhaar Drive (Survey)

NSS JIIT-128 conducted its Aadhaar Drive on the 29th of July 2019, with its primary objective being the Aadhaar scheme. Dr Vikas Malik served as the faculty in-charge of the activity. 68 students from the JIIT-128 campus volunteered in the drive by visiting the nearby village of Sultanpur and by inquiring about the Aadhaar status of various residents of the aforementioned village.

H. Brief description of the activity with appropriate details.

(i) About Aadhaar

Aadhaar is a 12-digit unique identity number that can be obtained voluntarily by residents or passport holders of India, based on their biometric and demographic data. The data is collected by the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI), a statutory authority established in January 2009 by the government of India, under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, following the provisions of the Aadhaar (Targeted Delivery of Financial and other subsidies, benefits and services) Act, 2016. Aadhaar is meant for individuals of any age which also includes children for the real purpose of establishing identities. Aadhaar will be different for the entire family members since, it is for only individuals. The demographic details that are residence address information of the person and also their bio-metric information which is photograph, Iris – scan, fingerprints are all collected and stored in a centralized database, for deciding uniqueness of every individual.

(ii) The Aadhaar drive on 29th of July, 2019.

Under the leadership of faculty in-charge Dr Vikas Malik, 68 students from JIIT-128 students visited the nearby village of Sultanpur, with the purpose of inquiring about the Aadhaar/Aadhaar-card status of various residents of the village. Students and teachers went from home to home, asking various residents of the village about their Aadhaar status. The volunteers were met with varied response, only a few residents of the village possessed

their Aadhaar card which had their correct details. Many residents of the village, when asked whether they had a proper Aadhaar card, replied that they in fact did not have one, even though they were meaning to get one for years. The volunteers then proceeded to collect necessary information of people who did not have an Aadhaar card, so that one could successfully apply for the Aadhaar card on their behalf. The information collected was safely documented in a secure place so as to no personal data of an individual was exposed.

Certain residents of the village who did have their Aadhaar card had some sort of error on their cards such as a misprint of their name, some error in their date of birth or wrong/former address.

Correct details of aforementioned residents were collected for making proper corrections on their Aadhaar Card. At the end of the day, volunteers from JIIT 128 had collected many datasets from the residents of Sultanpur, datasets of people who can be helped with the initiative taken by the JIIT 128 NSS team on the day.
